## WHY VOTE NO ON THE LIBERTYLAND CORPORATE WELFARE SCHEME

- ❖ On September 2, 2025, most of the Rapid City Council voted to gamble \$125M of your future tax dollars on a single tax giveaway for the privately-owned "Libertyland" theme park planned in the area north of I-90 between Dyess Ave. and E Disk Dr. The plan includes a Lifestyle Center, Lodging and Conference facilities, Housing and Timeshare units, including a 360-unit Resort Village and 300 home sites.
- ❖ \$47M of your <u>future tax dollars</u>, referred to as discretionary grants in the TIF plan, will pay the developer's costs, including construction, professional fees, and beautification of the property.
- ❖ The Libertyland TIF will reimburse the developer for \$54M in interest payments, although it's unclear who will be collecting the interest payments, because the developer is "self-financed."
- Only 7.5% (\$17M) of this money will be spent on city infrastructure improvements for public benefit.
- ❖ Rapid City and Pennington County taxpayers are already losing out on property tax revenue from \$700M in assessed valuation for 18 active TIF districts currently on the books. Have our streets improved? Have our property taxes gone down?
- ❖ FUN FACT: This project can have **cost overruns of up to 35% that will be approved** with a simple amendment. That could add **an additional \$43.7M** to the total TIF amount!
- ❖ The Pennington County Commission sent a letter to the Mayor and Council members expressing concern about the frequent use and size of Rapid City TIFs, their complexity, and the unusual purposes for which they are granted.
- ❖ The Commissioners expressed doubt about the long-term sustainability and public value of recent TIF agreements. They asked the City Council to require TIF applicants to appear before the County Commission, because every TIF Rapid City approves also affects Pennington County.
- ❖ The unemployment rate in Rapid City is 1.9%. It's unclear where the employees will come from to fill the estimated 2,000 jobs necessary to operate Libertyland.
- ❖ The people of Rapid City especially those living near the proposed project, were not asked about this project.
- This is a privately-owned business that is perfectly free to build this project without a TIF. If the project does not make sense without the TIF, does it really make sense at all?
- ❖ This is the largest TIF in state history.
